CHOCOLATE

Our pets, particularly dogs have a sweet tooth for chocolate. Ingestion of chocolate for our pets can be life-threatening. Clinical signs include hyperactivity, anxiousness, vomiting, diarrhoea and abnormal heart rhythms. These cases require veterinary care immediately to remove the toxin and manage the patient. If your pet does eat chocolate, ring us straight away. This will allow us to remove as much of the chocolate as possible as well as give your pet supportive care.
